1. Using your knowledge of history and the excerpts above, answer parts a, b and c.

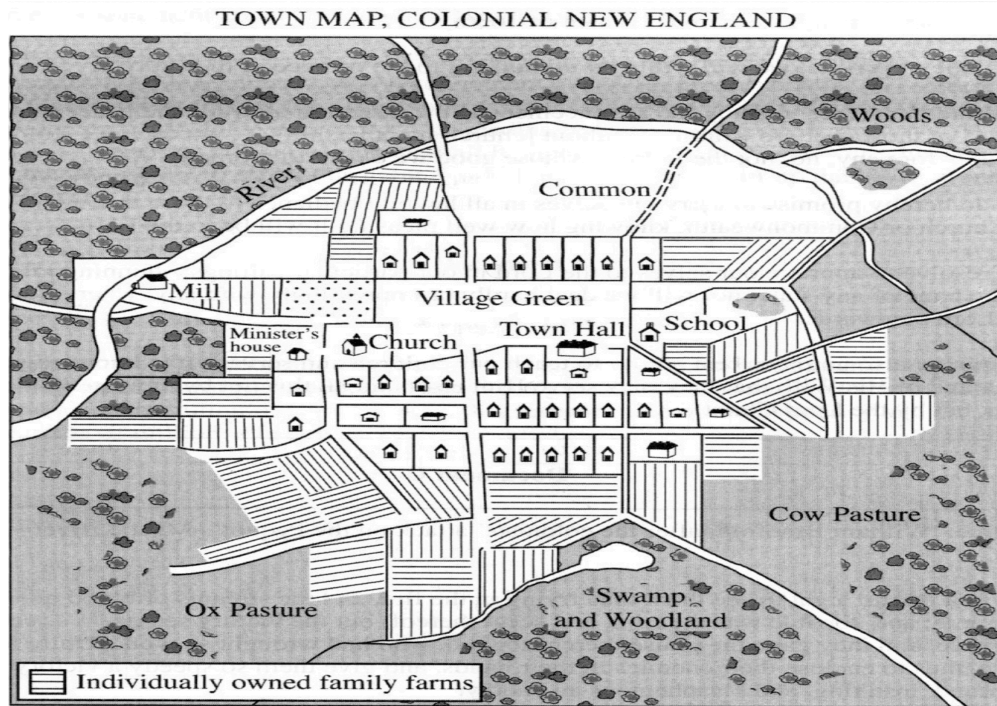
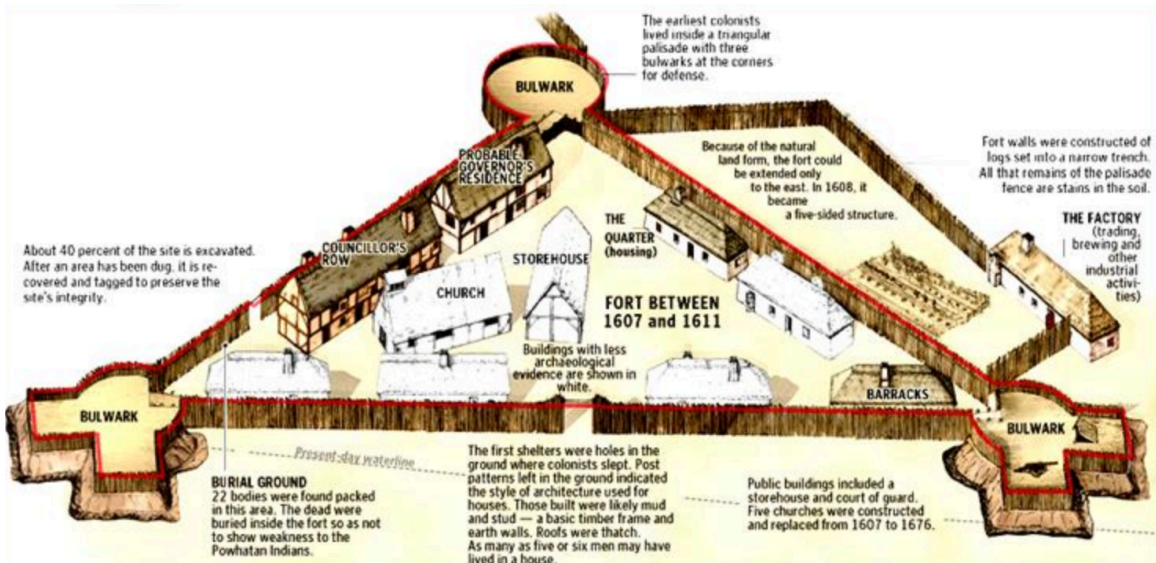
- A.) Briefly explain ONE major difference between the two excerpts.
